Efficiency Navigator Program - Building Spotlight

Sustain Dane and partners are hard at work with the [Efficiency Navigator program](#), supporting small to medium-sized affordable apartment housing to become more efficient, affordable, and resilient.

In Madison, we recently completed work on a 4-unit building built in 1958. Implementations at the building include weatherization with air sealing and insulation, boiler optimization, mold removal, gas leak repair, and other measures.

The efficiency upgrades performed will have an estimated annual cost savings of \$1,009 and estimated annual CO2 emissions savings of 4,064 kg. This is the equivalent of reducing 10,432 vehicle miles traveled per year.

Recycle Better - Picnics

Recycle Better Q & A – Summer Picnics

Question: What picnic related items can I recycle?

- Paper plates: Yes, paper plates can be recycled if they are clean and dry. If there is food residue on the plate, then place them in the trash.
- Red solo cups: No, red solo cups are not recyclable. Check out aluminum cups as an alternative.
- Bug spray: Yes, bug spray cans can be recycled if empty. Make sure to use it all up before putting it in your recycling bin.
- Plastic silverware: No, plastic silverware is not recyclable.

To be most environmentally healthy, consider reusable items for picnics such as reusable plates, cups, and silverware, as well as cloth napkins.

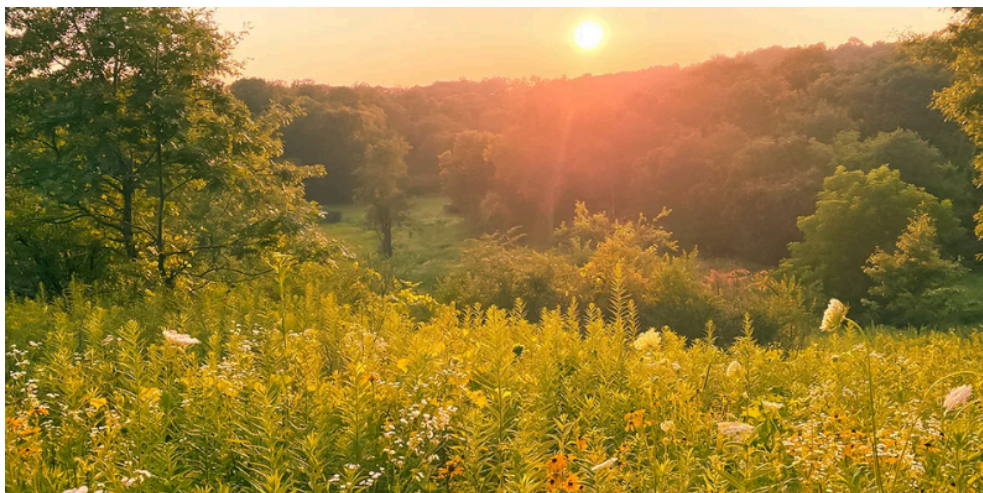

SBS Recap - Tourism Trends, Tips, & Sustainability

Sustainable Breakfast Series: Tourism Trends, Tips, & Sustainability – Recap

At our July Sustainable Breakfast Series, we explored the intersection of tourism and sustainability—unpacking the global and local impact of how we travel. With Dane County seeing a record-breaking \$1.55 billion in tourism spending last year and tourism representing 1 in 10 jobs worldwide, it is important to think about how we interact with tourism.

Attendees reflected on how sustainability has shown up in their own travel experiences and gained practical tips for being thoughtful, responsible travelers. Some of our favorite sustainable travel tips include:

- Visit natural areas to support their conservation.
- For transportation, consider direct flights to reduce CO₂ from air travel. Look into trains when feasible or considering renting an electric car.
- Support local businesses, tour companies, and try local foods.
- Look for eco certifications for lodging.

Our travel choices can be a powerful force for positive change.
